La Mesa Woman's Club Bylaws

ARTICLE I NAME

The name of this nonprofit organization, a 501 (C) 3 corporation, shall be La Mesa Woman's Club (LMWC).

ARTICLE II OBJECT

The object of the LMWC shall be the coordinating and promoting of activities for the cultural, charitable and intellectual advancement of our members and the community. LMWC will participate and cooperate with the CFWC Southern District, California Federation of Women's Clubs (CFWC) and the General Federation of Women's Clubs International (GFWC).

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. All persons who are in accord with the Object of this club shall be considered eligible for membership.

Section 2. This organization shall require no sectarian or partisan political test for membership; it is not a secret society.

Section 3. LMWC shall have three (3) types of membership: Active, Supporting and Honorary.

3a. ACTIVE MEMBERS shall pay annual dues and take an active part in club activities, including attending at least three (3) meetings annually, serving on at least 1 committee, and supporting the annual fundraiser. Active members may hold elective or appointive office or chairmanship, vote, sponsor a candidate for membership, are eligible to be a club delegate to CFWC Southern District and CFWC meetings and conventions and will receive a club newsletter and yearbook.

3b. SUPPORTING MEMBERS shall pay annual dues, support the major fund raiser and support LMWC further in whatever manner they can. Supporting members shall pay member rates to participate in events and fundraisers, receive the club newsletter and yearbook, vote, sponsor candidates for membership and may participate in all meetings and activities. Supporting members may not hold an office or chairmanship.

3c. HONORARY MEMBERSHIP may be conferred upon a member who has served as an officer and performed outstanding service to the club. Members presented with Honorary Membership will be exempt from paying dues. Honorary membership shall continue until the member is separated from the club.

Section 4. APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

4a. Applicants shall attend one (1) regular business meeting, being introduced to the members as a guest at that meeting and shall participate in one (1) club service activity before submitting a membership application.

4b. The application for membership shall be submitted on the club's official form and delivered to the chairman of the Membership Committee. The official application shall contain the name of one (1) member in good standing who will serve as sponsor of the applicant. Current annual dues shall accompany the application.

Section 5. RESIGNATION AND REINSTATEMENTS

5a. A member in good standing may resign by forwarding a letter to the Membership Chairman. To resign in good standing, one must have paid dues in full for the preceding year.

5b. A member may be terminated from membership by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Executive Board for nonperformance, wrongful conduct, absenteeism or nonpayment of dues.

5c. A member in good standing may be reinstated by submitting a written request to the Membership Chairman and paying the current dues in full.

ARTICLE IV OFFICERS, EXECUTIVE BOARD AND DELEGATES

Section 1. The ELECTIVE OFFICERS shall be President, First Vice-President, Second Vice President, Third Vice-President, Fourth Vice-President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer.

Section 2. The APPOINTIVE OFFICERS shall be Parliamentarian, Federation Chairman, Corresponding Secretary/Amenities Chairman and “Gavel Talk” Editor.

Section 3. The EXECUTIVE BOARD shall consist of the seven (7) elective officers and four (4) appointive officers, all of whom have one vote.

Section 4. The Executive Board shall have full authority to conduct, manage and control the affairs and business of LMWC and to make such rules and regulations that are consistent with the law, the Articles of Incorporation, these bylaws, and the bylaws of CFWC and GFWC. Section 5. If an elected or appointed officer fails to perform her duties, the Executive Board may declare the position vacant by a two-thirds (2/3) vote.

Section 6. A majority vote of the Executive Board is required for disbursement of funds exceeding five hundred (\$500) dollars for any one item. Any amount over five hundred (\$500) dollars shall require a vote of the General Assemblies at any business meeting except for bills for emergencies occurring between regular meetings of the club.

Section 7. DUTIES OF OFFICERS

7a. Elected Officers: President, First Vice-President, Second Vice-President, Third Vice-President, Fourth Vice-President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer.

7a1. The PRESIDENT shall preside at all meetings of the club and of the Executive Board. She shall select the appointive officers and the chairmen of standing committees, subject to the approval of the Executive Board. The President shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee.

7a2. In the absence of the President, the Vice-Presidents, in order, shall perform the duties of the President.

7a3. The FIRST VICE-PRESIDENT shall be Dean of Chairmen. She shall perform all the duties as required for the coordination of the activities of the Chairmen of the community service projects and assume the responsibility for submitting reports to CFWC Southern District. She shall be an ex-officio member of all committees except the Nominating Committee. She shall perform other duties as requested.

7a4. The SECOND VICE-PRESIDENT shall serve as Membership Chairman. She shall collect all dues and fees and transfer them to the Treasurer. She shall process new member applications and submit said names, addresses, telephone numbers and email addresses to the “Gavel Talk” Editor and the Telephone Committee. She shall explain the workings of the club in detail to new members. She shall maintain an accurate file on all members, including new members, resignations, deaths and address changes. She shall report such changes to the Executive Board, “Gavel Talk” Editor and Telephone Committee. At the end of her term of office she shall provide a current membership roster to the incoming President. She shall perform other duties as requested.

7a5. The THIRD VICE-PRESIDENT shall serve as Fundraising Chairman. She shall submit to the Executive Board for approval all proposed fundraising projects. She shall perform other duties as requested.

7a6. The FOURTH VICE-PRESIDENT shall serve as Program Chairman. She shall appoint a hostess for each General Assembly meeting. She shall be responsible for arrangements for meeting programs and the annual installation luncheon. She shall perform other duties as requested.

7a7. The RECORDING SECRETARY shall keep an accurate record of minutes of the General Assemblies and Executive Board meetings or special meetings as called. She shall present approved copies to the President, First Vice-President and Treasurer. She shall perform other duties as requested.

7a8. The TREASURER shall receive, disburse and keep an accurate record of all club monies. She shall prepare a monthly report of receipts and expenditures, presenting copies to the President, First Vice-President and Recording Secretary. She shall give a report at each of the monthly Executive Board and General Assembly meetings. Any member may receive a copy of the complete monthly Treasurer’s Report upon request. She shall pay out money only on authorization of the Executive Board, except for budgeted items. A receipt must

accompany any request for payment. She shall present the books to the Financial Review Committee for a financial review at the end of the club year. She shall be responsible for preparing an annual report for Federation and Internal Revenue Service purposes, as required. All normal clubhouse expenses and salaries shall be paid when due. If the office of Treasurer should become vacant, a financial review of the books shall be completed as of the date the office is vacated. She shall perform other duties as requested.

7b. Appointive Officers: Corresponding Secretary, Parliamentarian, "Gavel Talk Editor and Federation Chairman

7b1. The CORRESPONDING SECRETARY/AMENITIES shall be in charge of correspondence and amenities as directed by the President or Executive Board. She shall perform other duties as requested.

7b2. The PARLIAMENTARIAN shall act in an advisory capacity at all business and board meetings. She shall advise the President and members of Parliamentary procedures. She shall instruct the Nominating Committee in proper procedures. She shall be Chairman of the Bylaws Committee, which is comprised of 4 members appointed by the President.

7b3. The "GAVEL TALK" EDITOR shall collect articles from club members and publish the club newsletter each month.

5b4. The FEDERATION CHAIRMAN shall provide information regarding activities, events and meeting of the CFWC Southern District, CFWC, GFWC and other clubs to LMWC members. She shall encourage member participation in federation activities. She shall perform other duties as requested.

7c. All officers and chairmen shall submit reports as required by the LMWC and Federation.

7d. All officers and chairmen shall maintain and pass a procedure book to the in-coming officers and chairmen.

Section 8. SELECTION OF DELEGATES

8a. The President, or her representative, shall represent the club as a delegate to the CFWC Southern District meetings and convention.

8b. The President shall select delegates to represent the club at the CFWC Southern District meetings and convention on the basis of one (1) delegate for each twenty-five (25) members or major portion thereof. A delegate of the club may present any resolution adopted and recommended by the club to the Southern District.

8c. The President or her representative shall represent the club as a delegate to the CFWC State Convention.

8d. The President shall select delegates to represent the club at the State Convention on the basis of one (1) delegate for each twenty (20) or less members; one additional delegate for each additional ten (10) members or major fraction thereof.

8e. Delegates to State Convention shall be selected from those delegates already acting in this capacity to the Southern District, District Chairmen or the President-elect. The remaining need for delegates to Convention may be selected from the Executive Board and/or general assembly.

ARTICLE V ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Section 1. The Nominating Committee for the coming year shall be elected by the Executive Board in September.

Section 2. The Nominating Committee shall consist of three (3) members and one (1) alternate, one member from the Day Assembly, the Evening Assembly, the Executive Board and the combined bridge groups.

Section 3. At the first meeting of the Nominating Committee, the Parliamentarian shall advise the Committee of the proper procedures.

Section 4. The Nominating Committee shall elect its chairman from its members.

Section 5. The Committee shall present the proposed slate of officers in writing at the October meetings.

Section 6. Nominations may be made from the floor at the October and November meetings, provided the consent of the nominee has been obtained.

Section 7. Election of Officers shall be held at the November meetings.

Section 8. Officers shall be installed in December at the third Daytime Monday General Assembly meeting.
Section 9. The term of office shall begin at the date of installation.
Section 10. The term of office shall be one (1) year.
Section 11. Election shall be by ballot except when there is but one nominee for an office. If there is more than one office with one nominee, they may be elected by acclamation, collectively. A majority of those present and voting shall elect.
Section 12. The Executive Board shall fill a vacancy in any elective office. The President shall, with the approval of the Executive Board, appoint a member to fill a vacancy in an appointive office.

ARTICLE VI MEETINGS

Section 1. The club year will begin on January 1st and end on December 31st.
Section 2. LMWC General Meetings shall meet twice a month: once in the evening, on the second Wednesday of the month, except for the months of June, July and August; and quarterly once during the day on the third Monday of the month in the months of March, June, September and December. except for the months of July and August.
2a. Other Mondays may be used for benefits, teas and/or committee meetings, as desired. The Executive Board may make changes in this schedule.
Section 3. Eight (8) members shall constitute a quorum at meetings of the Daytime and Evening Assemblies.
Section 4. The Executive Board shall hold one regular meeting each month, as needed. Seven Six (7 6) members shall constitute a quorum.
Section 5. Special meetings of the General Assembly may be called by the Executive Board or upon request of eight (8) members. The President may call special meetings of the Executive Board, as needed.

ARTICLE VII CHAIRMEN AND STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. LMWC, subject to the approval of the Executive Board, may organize committees for special work. They shall arrange and manage their affairs. All members of such committees shall be members of LMWC.
Section 2. The CLUBHOUSE MAINTENANCE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE (CMC)
2a. The CMC will coordinate clubhouse activities and building maintenance. The committee shall consist of the Club President and at least four (4) but not more and approved by the Executive Board.
2b. The CMC shall coordinate with the Rental Manager regarding activities and building maintenance.
2c. Recommendations by the CMC which include expenditures for the clubhouse and custodial hiring and termination must be presented to the Executive Board for approval. Should an emergency occur, the President is to be notified and a special meeting of the Executive Board may be called.
2d. The CMC shall be responsible for an annual inventory. Copies of the inventory shall be given to the President and Treasurer and a copy shall be kept in the office.
2e. All proposed clubhouse expenditures over \$500 must be accompanied by 3 bids in writing and presented to the Executive Board for approval.
2f. Copies of all approved contracts must be maintained in writing in clubhouse files.
Section 3. The FINANCIAL REVIEW COMMITTEE shall perform a financial review of the books once at the end of the club year. The Financial Review Committee shall be comprised of 3 members appointed by the President. This report shall be presented to the Executive Board and General Assemblies at the first meeting following the financial review, with copies given to the President, First Vice-President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer.
Section 4. The BUDGET COMMITTEE shall consist of the in-coming and retiring officers: Presidents, Third Vice President, and Treasurer. The In-coming President shall serve as chairman. The Budget Committee shall present the proposed budget to the Executive Board and the General Assemblies in January. The Budget Committee shall meet to review the budget mid-year.

Section 5. The BYLAW COMMITTEE is appointed by the President when changes to the bylaws are deemed necessary. Four members will serve on that committee with the Parliamentarian serving as Chairman.

ARTICLE VIII DUES AND FUNDS

Section 1. Annual dues are payable December 1st and become past due on December 31st. After that date the member's name will be dropped from the roster and the member will no longer receive the "Gavel Talk" newsletter.

Section 2. Dues of new members, joining LMWC during or after June 15 shall be reduced to one-half the annual dues, but not less than the total amount of dues owing to CFWC Southern District, CFWC and GFWC.

Section 3. Money raised and designated for a specific purpose may be held for such use, but must be remitted through the club treasury.

Section 4. The Treasurer and Rental Manager shall be bonded and such bond shall be paid for by LMWC.

Section 4. Two signatures shall be required to withdraw money from all LMWC banking accounts. The President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer shall be eligible to sign checks or withdraw money from the savings and checking accounts.

Section 5. An emergency fund of up to ten thousand (\$10,000) dollars shall be reserved in an interest-bearing account to meet building emergency maintenance and repairs, subject to Executive Board approval.

ARTICLE IX AFFILIATION AND STATUS

LMWC is a member in good standing in CFWC Southern District, California Federation of Women's Clubs and General Federation of Women's Clubs International and the bylaws of LMWC conform to the bylaws of these federated organizations. LMWC, whose members are volunteers, is organized for non-profit purposes.

ARTICLE X DISSOLUTION

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable purposes and no part of the net income or assets of the corporation shall benefit any private person. Upon the dissolution or winding up of the corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment of all debts and liabilities of this corporation, shall be distributed to a nonprofit fund, foundation or corporation which is organized or operated exclusively for charitable purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501 (c) 3 of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE XI LIABILITY

Members of the Executive Board of LMWC shall not be personally liable for the debts, liabilities or other obligations of LMWC.

ARTICLE XII AUTHORITY

The current Robert's Rules of Order (Newly Revised) shall be the parliamentary authority. The bylaws of the club shall not in any way conflict with the bylaws of the General Federation of Women's Clubs or the California Federation of Women's Clubs.

ARTICLE XIII AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present and voting, providing prior notice of such amendment shall have been presented in writing to each member. and read at a previous meeting.

THESE REVISED BYLAWS BECAME EFFECTIVE:

STANDING RULES

1. Standing rules shall be amended by a majority vote of the members eligible to vote and who are present at General Assembly meetings.
2. Gifts, except monetary gifts, for the La Mesa Woman's Club must be approved by the executive Board.
3. Controversial matters are not to be brought before any general assembly of the La Mesa Woman's Club unless approved by the Executive Board, which would determine if both pro and con arguments are to be presented.
4. Members using the clubhouse for meetings or other activities must make arrangements with the Rental Manager.
5. Members attending group meetings at the clubhouse are responsible for providing their own refreshments and clean-up.
6. The annual dues shall be fifty (\$50.00) dollars.
7. Each paid member will receive an annual yearbook.
8. The In-coming and Out-going President's Club pin shall be passed on to each succeeding President unless the incumbent President desires to keep it and reimburses the Club for the cost of the pin.
9. The In-coming and Out-going Presidents shall be a nonpaying guest at installation.
10. LMWC shall pay the registration fee for the Club President and all delegates representing the club at CFWC Southern District meetings.
11. LMWC shall pay the registration and lunch fee for the Club President and First Vice- President at the CFWC Southern District Convention. They shall also pay the registration fee for all delegates representing the Club at CFWC and GFWC.
12. Anyone failing to cancel meal reservations within three (3) days prior to the event will be required to pay for the meal.
13. Any use of the LMWC Roster by any organization or individual is prohibited.
14. Every member is expected to support the annual major fund raiser.
15. Charitable contributions in the amount of \$100 shall be made in memory of a deceased member. \$50 shall be donated in honor of a member's deceased immediate family member.
